## Summer Term Reminders

We hope that the weather will soon become warmer and sunnier. To ensure all children remain comfortable and safe throughout the school day, we kindly remind families to follow our Summer School Uniform Policy and to take appropriate sun-safety precautions.

In hot weather, please ensure that your child comes to school each day with a cap or sunhat, sunscreen applied before school (children should be able to apply their own if bringing sunscreen) and a water bottle, clearly named to sip from throughout the day.

The approved summer uniform is outlined below. It is optional should pupils wish to wear these cooler items in the summer. All uniform should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

- Light blue and white checked summer dress (no shorts or playsuits)
- Grey shorts
- White, grey or navy socks
- Black shoes
- Summer sandals may be worn but must be navy or black and secure

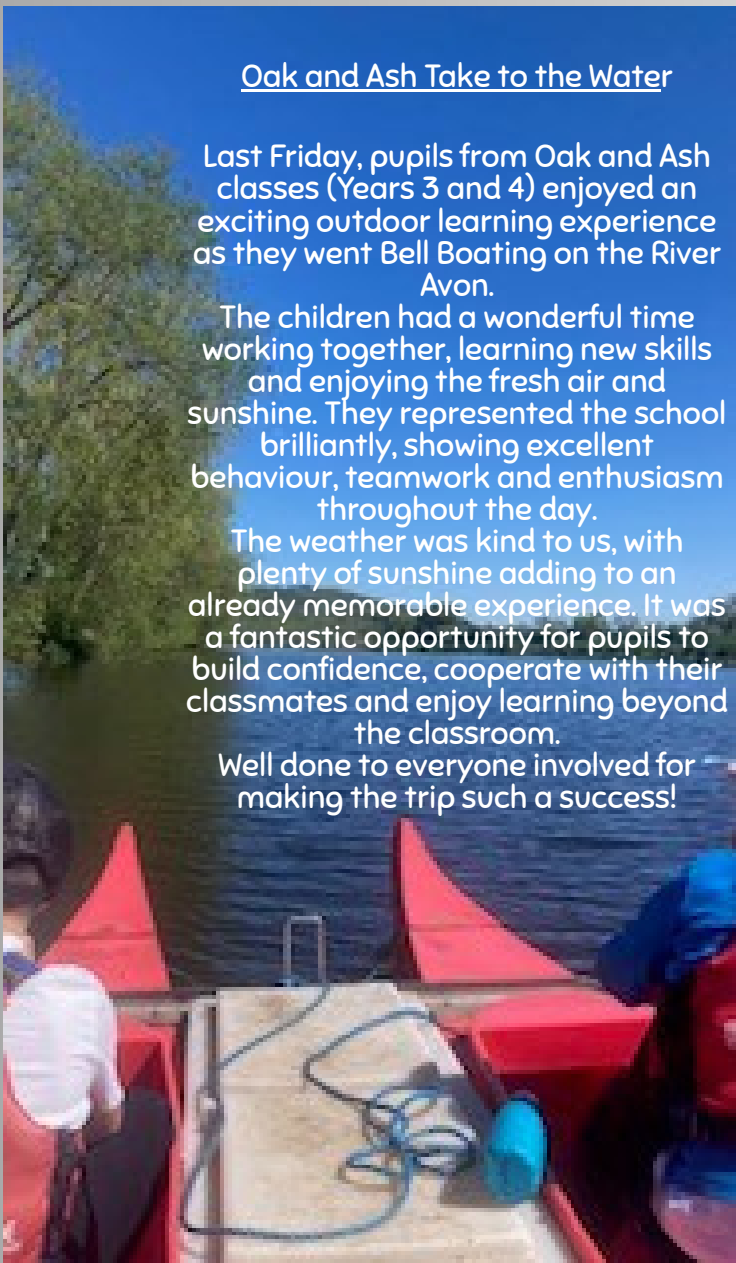
## Oak and Ash Take to the Water

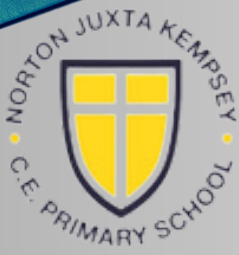
