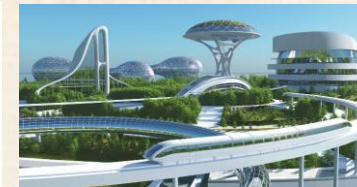

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Tudor houses	Houses built a long time ago, with wooden frames and white walls.
Charles II	A king of England who lived after the Great Fire of London.
Great Fire of London	A big fire in 1666 burned down much of London.
London	The capital city of England.
1666	A year in history when the Great Fire of London happened.
Christopher Wren	An architect who designed new buildings after the fire, including St Paul's Cathedral.
Victorian houses	Houses built when Queen Victoria was queen. They are often made from red bricks.
Queen Victoria	A queen of England in the 1800s who ruled for many years.
Past	Something that has already happened.
Before	Something that happened earlier than now.
After	Something that happened later than another event.
Industrial Revolution	A time when many machines were invented and people started working in factories.
Queen Elizabeth II	A queen of the United Kingdom who ruled for many years in modern times.
Elizabethan houses	Houses built when Queen Elizabeth I was queen, often with wooden beams.
King Charles III	The king of the United Kingdom today.
Modern	Things from now or recent times.
Present day	What is happening now.
Future	Things that have not happened yet.
Century	A period of 100 years.
Decade	A period of 10 years.
Electricity	Power that makes lights, computers, and machines work.
Bricks	Hard blocks used for building walls.
Tiles	Flat pieces, often on roofs or floors, made from clay or stone.
Wattle and daub	A way of building walls using sticks and mud.
Wood	Material from trees, used for building and making things.
Stone	A hard material from the ground used to build strong walls.
Metal	A hard, shiny material used for tools, machines, and buildings.
Building regulations	Rules to keep buildings safe and strong.
