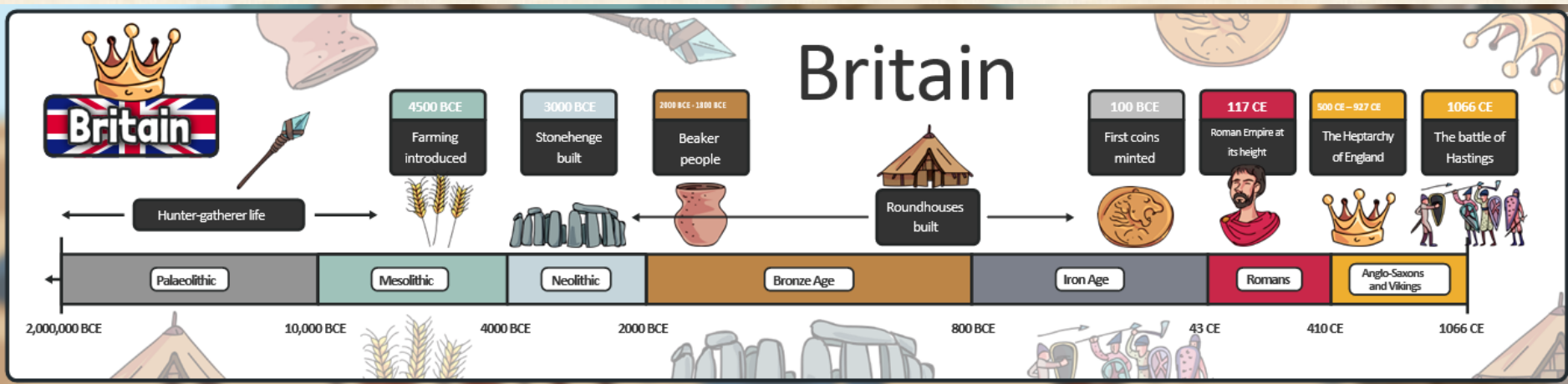
What was life like in the Paleolithic and Mesolithic?

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Archaeologist	A person who studies the past through excavation and the study of artefacts.
Artefacts	Objects made by human beings in the past.
Bronze	An alloy metal made of molten tin and copper.
Burial	The act of putting of a body in the ground.
Domestication	The adaption of wild plants and animals for human use.
Excavation site	Place where archaeologists dig in teams to find artefacts an remains from the past.
Historian	A person who studies the past using documents and images.
History	Written records about the past.
Iron	A rock which can be used to make iron.
Jewellery	Necklaces, bracelets etc
Prehistory	Time before written records.
Preserve	Keep an object safe from loss.
Remains	What is left over
Temporary	Lasting for only a short time.
