

Sport Premium Report 2016-2017

PE and Sport play a very important part in the life of Norton Juxta Kempsey CE First School and at least two hour sessions per week are dedicated to physical activity in the curriculum. We believe that physical education and sport contribute to the holistic development of young people and through participation in sport and physical education, young people learn more about key values such as teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others. There is significant evidence to show the positive effects of sport and exercise on children's physical health, growth and development. Furthermore, sport also provides a healthy environment for young people to learn how to deal with competition and how to cope with both winning and losing.

In PE, we want to inspire young people to participate in and enjoy physical activity. We want them to recognise the importance of an active and healthy lifestyle which continues into adulthood. Our school values help with effective learning and participation in PE.

In April 2013, the Government announced funding (Sport Premium) for physical education (PE) and sport to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision at School, for two years.

The School Sports Premium Funding is to be continued this year and NJK has received an initial allocation for 2016-2017 of £4,993.00.

Vision

Through investment in quality CPD and effective teaching and learning we provide opportunities for pupils to assume responsibility for their learning and to engage their inquisitive minds. We want to provide moments of inspiration and enjoyment that will remain with them beyond their time at Norton Juxta Kempsey CE First School.

Funding received 1st November 2016 £4993.00

Funding received 30th April 2017 £3567.00

Aims

To provide support, training and equipment to enable our pupils to be more active in school and at home. As part of the PE curriculum we aim give all pupils a wider understanding and enjoyment of physical activity. We will purchase new equipment, replace existing equipment and provide PE training for teaching staff.

How will we meet our aims?

The following actions are currently being implemented:

- The purchase of equipment to enhance both lesson and recreational time for the pupils
- Providing training for teaching staff based on newly purchased PE Scheme (Lancashire/SSN Scheme)
- Providing transport pupils to sporting events
- Employment of a Quality assured (through SSN) of a Sports Coach for CPD
- To support our schools Energy Group (pupils)
- To help to make playtime active and enjoyable for all pupils

- To encourage being part of a team and working together in particular CPD for staff on OAA

Impact of Sports Premium Grant 2016-2017

In July 2016 the school PE Leader (Co-Head Mrs Dean) completed the Level 5 Certificate in Physical Education. The course took place throughout 2015-2016 and in September 2016 Mrs Dean was accredited with the Level 5 Certificate in PE. The coursework offered specialist CPD and an opportunity to review the school's current PE provision ensuring that it reflects both local and national needs.

Impact: Increased specialist PE knowledge in school

Several inter-school competitions took place with transport being funded by Sports Premium in order to facilitate the events. Please see gallery/news on school website for photographs of some of these events.

Impact: Increased % in pupil participation in inter-school competitions for 2016-2017

The Sports Grant also enabled the school to purchase playground equipment and a specialist sports coach so that pupils can enjoy taking part in physical activities during some playtimes and lunchtimes.

Impact: Increased pupil activity levels and enjoyment during playtimes especially for target group of pupils (see Whole School Provision Map 2016-2017)

A specialist coach was employed by HT and governors to consult with HT on best practice for games, PE lessons and other areas of the curriculum to meet the needs of our new, improved PE curriculum.

Impact: Improved staff knowledge of FMS in order to accurately baseline pupils in PE. All pupils baselined and progress measured at the end of the year. 94% pupils across the school at ARE in PE.

Resources will be purchased to help implement the new areas of the PE curriculum (following an audit). Lancashire/SSN Scheme of Work.

Impact: 94% pupils across the school at ARE in PE.

Sports Premium Funding:

This academic year 2016 2017 we have been allocated £8,560 in sports premium funding. A total spend of £9522 has been spent in school on the above provision this year.
