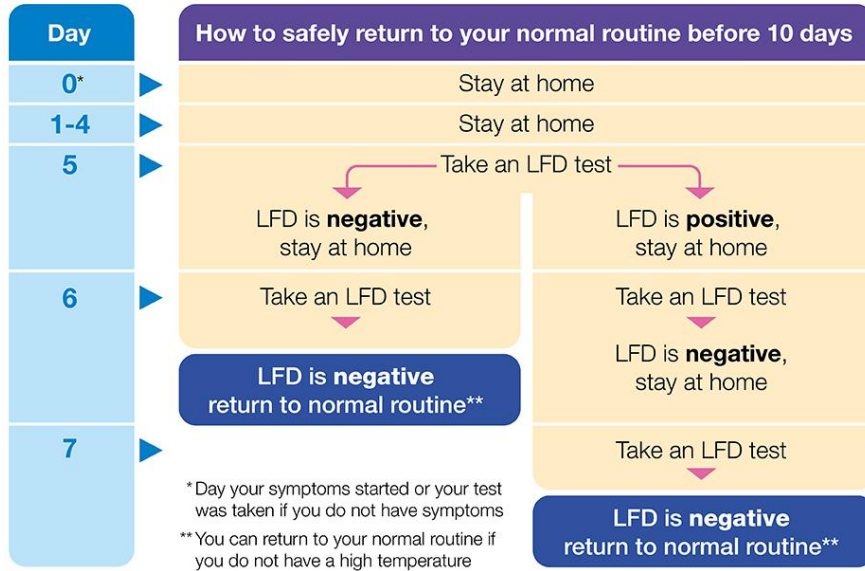
Covid Guidelines

The key message at this point is that pupils still must not attend school whilst they are infectious, despite the headline about lifting the legal requirement to self-isolate. The main points from this guidance and separate schools' operational guidance are summarised below:

- If you have any of the main symptoms of Covid-19 (a recent onset of a new continuous cough; a high temperature; or a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell) you should order a PCR test. You are advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people while you wait for the test result.
- If you test positive, you should continue to stay at home and avoid contact with other people. This includes not attending work.
- If you can, you should let people who you have been in close contact with know about your positive test result.
- Children and young people with Covid-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from five days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day.
