Information Letter 8- Spring Term 2021 – 2022

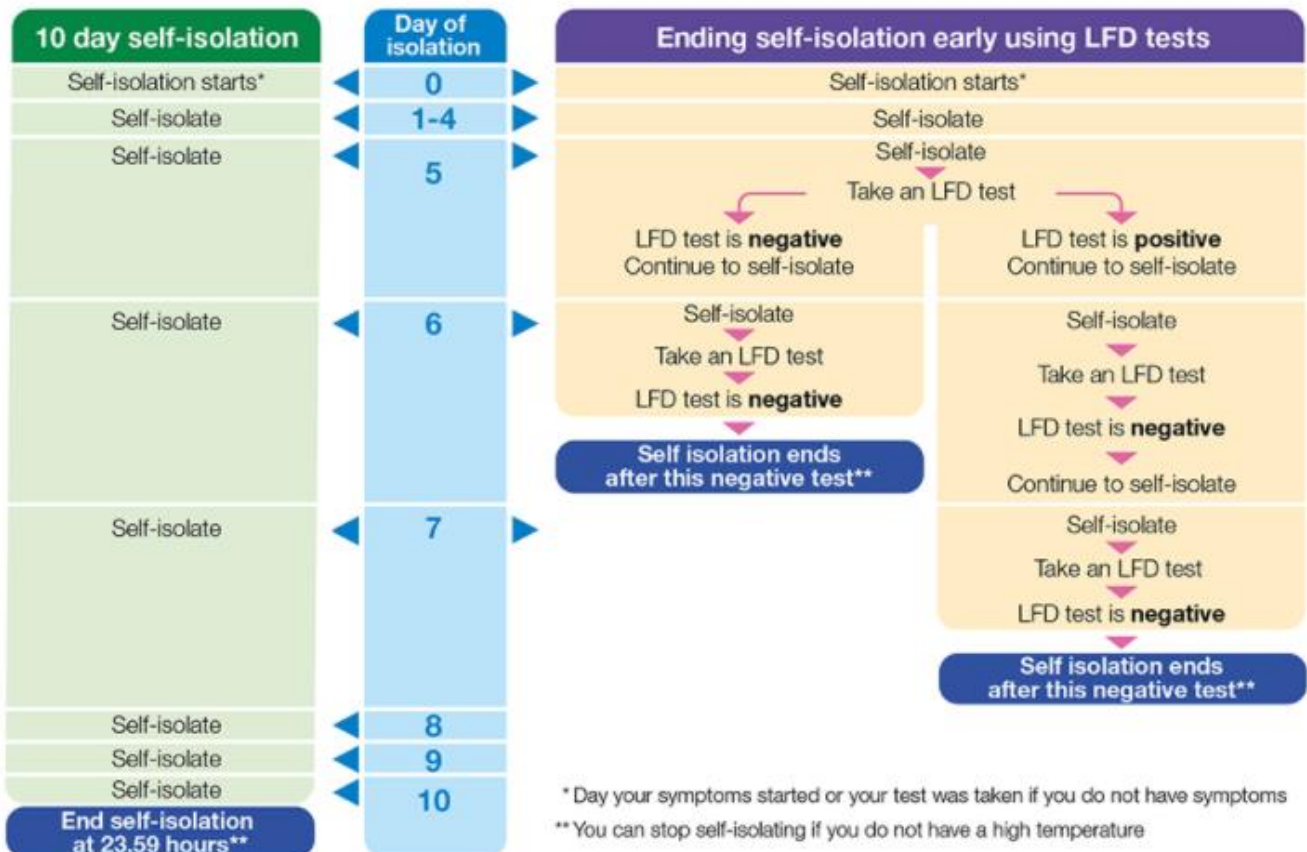
The self-isolation advice for people with coronavirus (COVID-19) has changed. It is now possible to end self-isolation after 5 full days if you have 2 negative LFD tests taken on consecutive days. The first LFD test should not be taken before the fifth day after your symptoms started (or the day your test was taken if you did not have symptoms). The self-isolation period remains 10 full days for those without negative results from 2 LFD tests taken a day apart.

Here is an overview of the positive cases in school and a clarification of the latest isolation rules published 1st February.

Positive Covid Cases

- Elm- 3 pupils
- Cedar- 1 pupils and 1 staff member
- Ash- 3 pupils and 1 staff member
- Oak- 2 pupils
- Hazel- 6 pupils and 1 staff member

Examples of when to end self-isolation if you have had COVID-19 symptoms or have received a positive COVID-19 test result





Start and End of Day Procedures

Pupils in Years 5 and 6 can walk to school and walk home with parental permission. The forms to sign are available from the school office. Here is a reminder of the conditions outlined in the letter:

- I give permission for my child to leave the school premises unaccompanied at the end of the school day
- I have walked the route with my child in preparation for them walking alone
- I confirm that I or another trusted adult will be at home prior to and after school

All other pupils in year groups R-4 must be accompanied to the school gates in the morning and collected from the classroom doors at the end of the day.
